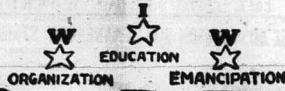

### CRANBROOK WORKERS STRIKE BACK TO LOGGING CAMPS

Organized Mass Movement to Seize the Eight-Hour Day; the Fight Is Still On.

CRANBROOK, May 22.—The strike in the Cranbrook district, involving some logging outfits and three mills, has been taken back to the job. The members have decided to go back and use all manner of tactics possible, according to the conditions existing on the job where they happen to be. All during the strike great solidarity was shown by the workers as a whole and, considering the number of men and the fact that the strike is in a remote country, the scab list is very small. We will have this last ready in a day or two. We want to be very careful about names we publish, so that there will be no mistakes made.

CRANBROOK, May 19.—At a special meeting held at Cranbrook last night, with 36 members and 18 non-striker strikers present, it was decided that if the strike is taken back to the job, this branch is in favor of "TAKING THE EIGHT-HOUR DAY TO THE FIRMS AS WE WORK." This means that the members here going back on the job, when we have worked the first eight hours, some give a signal and the whole crew goes to camp. If they get fired, they are further ahead as they will have won one eight-hour day anyway. Another crew can come in and do the same thing, and it will not be long until the companies will get tired of that and of staff and will decide to leave us alone.

### LOGGERS REFUSE CONTRACT WORK

Fifty Men Quit Vance Lumber Co. to Show They Know What Piece Work Means.

MALONE, Wash.—Over fifty percent of the crew at the Vance Lumber company logging camp at Malone, Wash., walked off the job, Tuesday, May 22. Practically all the fallers and buckers and a great number of the rigging crew left. As the rigging crew is right up on the work, at the most very most, three days logging until there is no more timber down, the company will feel the pinch nicely.

The walkout was caused by the company's attempt to start bushwork. Up till present it has all been day work. However, during the last strike a few firms were put to logging timber on the side where the timber is best. Being of the usual kind, they could only get out at the most 16,000 feet per day. Naturally we took this to be all they wanted so they were careful not to exceed the speed limit. The finks were canned and about a dozen Polish loggers were hired in Aberdeen to work by bush. When they heard that was day work and the other two sides refused to tackle the job. When we noticed their attitude we called a meeting and decided to stick with them and demand that they also be put on day work and we would all go down to the mill.

One fellow worker got discharged Monday evening for selling our papers and that was the end of solidarity ever seen in this country, and we are only beginning at that! We have a policy of making friendly relations with a certain class of labor leaders is indicated by the statement of our informant that Burns' advice was received with "wild applause."

Accidentally I happened to ask her if it was California berries. "It sure is," she says.

"Well," I replied, "then I can't eat them." She wanted to know why and I sure explained it. I must admit that she grasped the logic in my arguments and thought it was the best thing we could do to let the California ranchers have their berries until they see fit to release our fellow workers in the penitentiaries. Besides, the local berries are better and we should not spoil our appetite for strawberries and cream in advance to the appearance of the local crop, but have the boss to supply us with a lot of them when they come, they are very healthy.
